- City Council approval of (1) authorization of the City Manager to enter into an agreement in the amount of \$55,000 with Callander Associates Landscape Architecture, Inc. to conduct the Bay Trail Feasibility Study and (2) the allocation of \$13,000 from the current Measure "A" Account to fund the project.
- 3. Approval of an agreement in the amount of \$38,500 with Hohbach-Lewin, Inc. to provide design services for the Willow Place Bicycle and Pedestrian Bridge Replacement Project; and approve a total project design budget of \$58,500 including staff time and contingencies.
