Approval of a Resolution authorizing the City Manager to amend the Management Compensation System to adjust control points, to grant compensation increases up to 5.5 percent effective July 1, 2002, and award bonuses up to a maximum of \$5,000 based on merit and in accordance with the Management Pay for Performance System for Employees in positions classified as management.
