The City Council brainstormed and developed an initial list of goals and values.

- 1. People in MP are, and feel they are, safe
- 2. Downtown is revitalized
- 3. The budget is sustainable and resilient
- 4. The local economy is vibrant and resilient, benefiting all
- 5. Diverse residents are engaged in decision-making
- 6. MP has an updated General Plan and Zoning Ordinance
- 7. Inequities across the community are decreased
- 8. The negative impacts of HSR are minimized and the benefits are maximized
- 9. People in MP safely and easily move to their destinations
- 10. Neighborhoods are preserved and property rights are protected
- 11. MP's carbon footprint is lowered and the community is prepared for the consequences of climate change
- 12. Cultural and recreational enrichment is available to all
- 13. Productive partnerships with local schools enhance synergy of effort
- 14. MP has an up-to-date Municipal Code
- 15. MP is seen as world-class / has a world class "brand"
- 16. Opportunities for natural recreation are increased
- 17. Housing issues are addressed
- 18. MP has a sustainable water supply for the long term

Direction was given to staff to flesh out the goals by developing a set of strategies and indicators that would help the Council choose which goals should be the priority for the coming year.
