2. Review of comments on the Draft Climate Action Plan and direction to staff regarding future updates of the Climate Action Plan (Staff Report #09-056)

Council comments summary:

Two speakers on this item:

- Nils Davis Future versions of CAP should include performance incentives. LEED or Build-it-Green points no good enough. Need specific standards for energy efficiency.
- Adina Levin Disappointed that City not supporting Green Business program. Urge Council to approve this version (of CAP) as long as commit to revise/update, significant changes, ongoing.

K. Fergusson:

- 1. Option 2 (of targets) should be more ambitious
- 2. Next version should look at land use and building standards at policy level
- 3. CAP should recognize current and previous actions/strategies by City with statement "not all inclusive." Add Climate Smart, rebated projects and community-driven activities (e.g. GRCC formation, Drive Less Challenge).
- 4. Implementation of Green Business certification
- 5. Should mention San Mateo County Sustainability report (Energy Strategy 2012) and Green Business Certification Program
- 6. Should mention performance contracting as potential strategy
- 7. List references including documents provided by GRCC (handout provided by staff at meeting that was inadvertently left out of packet of comments)

<u>J. Boyle:</u>

"Plan" does not mean must do. Difficult to support plan in May if not specific enough.

A. Cohen:

Palo Alto focusing on increasing shuttle service. Should increase MP shuttle service or study. Should GRCC take an active role in research and analysis for CAP?

R. Cline:

Would like to see a set of actions with a timeline showing early-mid-long term implementation. Want an outline of next steps presented (with final CAP) in May.

H. Robinson:

Want specific actions in plan that City can implement now. How could City create sustainable funding source for climate work? Ask EQC to develop subcommittee. How can we create sustainable funding for this long term? Should consider a Climate/Energy Coordinator.
