

# CITY COUNCIL COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AGENCY SPECIAL MEETING MINUTES

Tuesday, August 25, 2009 at 5:00 p.m. 701 Laurel Street, Menlo Park, CA 94025 City Council Chambers

### STUDY SESSION

The Council convened in study session at 5:06 p.m. with all members present.

1. Review of El Camino Real/Downtown Specific Plan project status and opportunity for Council member feedback (Staff report # 09-113) (PowerPoint Presentation)

Thomas Rogers introduced the item and the consultants from Perkins + Will updated the Council on the project. The Council asked clarifying questions.

# Public comments on the item:

- Nancy Couperus Lack of notice to downtown business owners; send out notices that are similar in format to other public notices
- **John Chiappe** concerns with the construction and the impacts during that time
- **Jo Eggers** Proposed continuing the process given the lack of time for understanding the project scope
- Steve Elliot, Stanford University Spoke to the process and feels it has worked to this point
- Frank Carney He believes that no higher than 2 stories on Santa Cruz should be allowed
- Reg Rice Survey 2 years ago that indicated traffic flow on El Camino Real was the biggest problem and this needs to be addressed during this process and project; send out another survey
- Fran Dehn Appreciated that the comments made last night during the Planning Commission were included in the presentation tonight; distinguish between El Camino Real and Santa Cruz Avenue
- Robert Lico People are not showing up because they are not informed or at a different point in their lives; there is a need for structured parking; focus on El Camino Real and not infill
- **Bruce Beekley** Commend the process; has only known about the process for four days; structured parking is important; traffic flow in Menlo Park needs to improve
- Morris Brown Stanford needs to be forthcoming with their preferences for their property

## Council Comments on the item:

# Fergusson:

- Critical piece between density and public benefit
- Concerns that buildings greater than 2 stories would need to provide for some public benefit
- Looking for something subtle that will not give a shift to the look
- Have a design charette around the topic of HSR more will be known after the draft EIR is out
   she would like them involved in that process

## John Boyle:

- He would like more added to the structured time during the next workshop
- There is a challenge to explain all of the information including why and why not for the preferred alternatives

- Difficult to digest and comment; in one meeting prefers to create more opportunities for the public to present their comments off-line, make it easy for them to take it home, digest it and then provide input
- Concerned about setting expectations regarding the specificity of the plan there are areas
  identified as 'boutique or hotel" but it is not clear where the line is going to be drawn with the
  preferred uses.

# Andy Cohen:

- Community engagement is missing in the plan need to increase the outreach; he does not hear that the outreach will change to make it happen
- He would try to require that on Stanford land there would be affordable senior housing
- Important to keep in mind that outreach and community engagement is important since there was a large group of community members stated they were unaware of the process

## Rich Cline:

- Management of community engagement will be up to staff since outreach is not in the consultant contract or part of the plan
- Additional outreach should be done and quickly, but by staff

## Heyward Robinson:

- Desire for additional outreach
- Should be focusing on process; at the end of the day, the Council has to approve a plan as the Council moves to that point, the Council has to take ownership of it
- The Council needs to start saying what they like and there needs to be that opportunity
- There are ideas that still will be tested
- Should the oversight committee host small events around the city (a member of staff or the consultant should be present to have the same information presented)
- Need to be up-front about the impacts and people need time to digest the information; wants the information to be accessible
- There may need to be additional iterations of the emerging plan
- Are the difficult decisions being left to the Council based on a staff recommendation (density, height)
- Encourage use of the website for frequently asked questions and updates regarding the process and the emerging plan
- Why have we not used Survey Monkey or other methods to gauge community involvement
- Stay within the approved timeline
