

CITY COUNCIL COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AGENCY SPECIAL MEETING MINUTES

Tuesday, September 1, 2009 at 5:00 p.m. 701 Laurel Street, Menlo Park, CA 94025 City Council Chambers

The Council convened in study session at 5:07 p.m. with all members present.

STUDY SESSION #1

• Consider the results of the Transportation Impact Fee (TIF) Study and provide guidance on parameters for the preparation of an Ordinance (<u>Staff report # 09-116</u>)

Staff presentation by Charles Taylor, Transportation Manager in conjunction with TJKM Transportation Consultants Joy Bhattacharya and Chris Kinzel.

Comments from the public on the item:

• Fran Dehn - relationship between this and the construction impact fee; the list of cities should be more like Menlo Park; look at a staged approach or no change until after a preferred or specific plan for downtown is complete

Questions for the Council:

• Are the included improvements measures the appropriate improvement measures to include? The consensus of the Council was that the types of improvements and the mix of improvements were appropriate and should be included. There were some suggestions for the inclusion of other items into the study such as Bus Rapid Transit lanes, pedestrian overcrossing especially near Bayfront and to provide an emphasis on other modes of travel such as walking, transit and biking.

• Should the Transportation Impact Fee be set at the maximum rate?

The consensus of the Council was that the maximum fee based on the TIF study should be set in the ordinance. The Council had concerns regarding the higher fee for retail and restaurant projects.

• Should a credit to the fee be provided for projects that construct improvement measures included in the fee?

The consensus of the Council was that credit towards the fee should be given to projects that provide construction of improvements that are included in the plan.

• How should existing land uses be credited toward the TIF?

The consensus of the Council was that a credit should be provided toward the TIF based on previous land use square footage and/or dwelling units.

STUDY SESSION #2

 Consideration of the Parks and Recreation Commission's recommendation to provide direction to staff regarding Menlo Children's Center (MCC) toddler, early preschool and preschool care at the Civic Center (<u>Staff report # 09-121</u>)

Staff presentation by Starla Jerome-Robinson, Assistant City Manager

Comments from the public on the item:

• Yael Caspi – provided a handout and spoke to the increase in participants and income to the program

- **Diana Pohlman** spoke regarding getting a business plan together for the program
- Beau De LeMenie spoke to the great quality of the program
- Yan Li supports the program

- Asnat Loewenthal She praised the program over the past few months, discussed the improvements, and encouraged the City to keep the program going and not privatize it.

- Ritika Suri Spoke to the success of the program and do not privatize
