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Mayor Cline called the regular session to order at 6:00 p.m. with all members present except Council Member Fergusson was participating by telephone from Oregon per the duly noticed meeting notice and Agenda. The Mayor inquired if there was anyone who wanted to address the Council on the one agenda item on the posted Agenda.

There being nobody present other than the four Council Members, the City Attorney and the City Manager, with Council Member Fergusson on the speaker phone, the Council adjourned to closed session on the below item when no members of the public appeared to speak to the item.

1. Closed Session pursuant to Government Code section 54956.9 (a) to conference with legal counsel regarding existing litigation.

Case: Katy Rose/AFSCME v City of Menlo Park, San Mateo Superior Court, Case No. CIV 496204, related to Pension Reform Initiative

At 7:55 the Council reconvened in open session and the Mayor requested the City Attorney to report on action taken by the Council in closed session.

The City Attorney reported that the City Council by unanimous vote directed the City Attorney to file an opposition to the Petition for Writ of Mandate and Complaint for Declaratory Relief and Injunctive Relief filed by the Plaintiffs/Petitioners, Katy Rose, AFSCME Local 829 and SEIU Local 521, and to request that the Court deny the Petition and allow the Pension Reform Initiative to remain on the November 2010 ballot.

There being no further action and no public comment, the meeting was adjourned at 7:57 p.m.
