#### C. PUBLIC COMMENT #1

- Allan Bedwell Commended the Police Department, Council Member Fergusson and staff to their response to the recent burglaries in the Willows area.
- Steve Zanolli Spoke regarding the Request for Proposal process for operating the Burgess Pool and requested there be equal resources available for all program providers at the Burgess Pool including on-site material and on the web.
- Barbara Franklin Stated that the Smoking Ordinance on the consent calendar is a good start and hopes the issues related to restricting smoking in multi-unit dwellings will be addressed.
- Kristi Breish Spoke to the success of the recent fundraiser for Project Read.

## D. CONSENT CALENDAR

1. Adoption of a Resolution accepting water main easement, authorizing the City Manager to sign the Certificate of Acceptance; awarding a contract to Fermin Sierra Construction, Inc. in the amount of \$719,470; and authorizing a total budget of \$935,310 for construction, contingencies, testing, inspection, and construction administration (Staff report #10-134)

Action: Motion and second (Robinson/Fergusson) to adopt Resolution No. 5963 accepting a water main easement, authorizing the City Manager to sign the Certificate of Acceptance; awarding a contract to Fermin Sierra Construction, Inc. in the amount of \$719,470; and authorizing a total budget of \$935,310 for construction, contingencies, testing, inspection, and construction administration passes with the following votes: (Ayes: Boyle, Cline, Cohen, Fergusson; Noes: None; Absent: Robinson.)

#### **Public Comments:**

- Anne Moser Suggested that the community and staff work together on this application.
- Nancy Borgeson Urged the Council not to approve the resolution.
- Eileen McLaughlin Suggested that this grant application be held until the next funding cycle.
- Robin Winslow Smith Stated the western flyway goes over through and around the park and this project will cause harm. She questioned the disappearance of all of the ground squirrels.
- Chris Macintosh Suggested the City do additional investigation and wait until the next funding cycle to move forward.
- Allan Bedwell Stated this project will have impacts to the park and more public input is necessary. He suggested waiting until the next funding cycle, and is concerned with greenhouse gas emissions.

**Action:** Motion and second (Robinson/Boyle) to adopt **Resolution No. 5962** approval of an application for grant funds from the Environmental Enhancement and Mitigation Program for the Highway 84 Widening Carbon Dioxide Mitigation Project, passes unanimously.

1. Consideration of Appeal of Public Works Department denial of an encroachment permit for the existing fence in the public right-of-way fronting 900 Cambridge Avenue (<u>Staff report #10-135</u>)

#### Appellant:

The appellant, Tom Wandless, gave a PowerPoint presentation which included a timeline of the current fence and city processes, design considerations, the City's reasons for the denial and their reasons for keeping the fence in place. (PowerPoint)

# Concerns from the City Council:

- Would allowing the fence to remain set a precedent?
- The possibility of damage to the heritage tree behind the fence should there be a change in property owners.
- Concern with the liability if a tree limb falls and injures another party.
- What are the plans for implementing the sidewalks in that neighborhood relative to the Sidewalk Master Plan?
- Concern with not maintaining the right-of-way and how it could be protected with a change in property owners.

**Action:** Motion and second (Robinson/Cohen) to grant the appeal of the Public Works Department denial of an encroachment permit for the existing fence in the public right-of-way fronting 900 Cambridge Avenue, with the following conditions:

- A deed restriction/maintenance agreement be recorded against the property, approved by the City Attorney agreeing to:
  - Maintain and trim the City street trees located within the enclosed portion of the right-of-way; and
  - Provide access to any existing utilities within the enclosed portion of the right-of-way and to remove the fence if any future utilities or roadway improvements, including sidewalks, are planned in this area; and
  - Defend, indemnify and hold the City harmless from all liability, claims and lawsuits for any accidents or damage that occurs or arises either within the enclosed portion of the right-of-way or as a result of the location of the fence including damage caused by City street trees enclosed inside the fence.
  - The fence on the West side of driveway will be removed.

The motion passes by the following votes: Ayes: Cline, Cohen, Robinson; Noes: Boyle, Fergusson.
