Commission Report: Adopt a Resolution to install a passenger loading

zone and red curb on Pine Street at Oak Grove

Avenue

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Complete Streets Commission adopt a resolution (Attachment A) to install a 5-minute passenger loading zone (white curb and signage) and red curb (removing a total of three on-street parking spaces) on Pine Street at Oak Grove Avenue to provide a short-term loading area for adjacent residents.

Policy Issues

The recommendation is consistent with Section 11.24.026 of the City ordinance, which authorizes the Complete Streets Commission to designate "No Parking Zone" (i.e., red curb and other on-street parking restrictions) adjacent to driveways, intersections and crosswalks under specific criteria for safety concerns.

This project is also consistent with the policies and programs (i.e., CIRC-1.1, CIR-4.4) stated in the 2016 General Plan Circulation Element. These policies and programs seek to maintain and improve a circulation system through the Street Classification System that provides safe and efficient movement of people and goods throughout Menlo Park for residential and commercial purposes.

Background

On November 13, 2018, City Council adopted a resolution to approve the permanent installation of bicycle improvements on Oak Grove Avenue, Crane Street, and University Drive which included removing on-street parking on Oak Grove Avenue. During the City Council meeting, several residents from the apartment complex located at the corner of Pine Street and Oak Grove Avenue expressed concerns that their elderly and disabled residents and visitors have a difficult time accessing their building due to the removal of parking on Oak Grove Avenue. While their building has an underground parking area, the stairs are challenging for deliveries and access for some of their residents. The residents prefer a loading area on Oak Grove Avenue where their front entrance is located, however, the existing roadway width doesn't provide enough room for the bike lanes and a loading zone. As part of their approval, City Council directed staff to move forward with the implementation of a loading zone on Pine Street to provide a short-term loading area for the adjacent residents while the design feasibility of a vehicle cut-out on Oak Grove Avenue is assessed.

Analysis

Pine Street is a local road that connects Oak Grove Avenue to Ravenswood Avenue. Currently, Pine Street allows parking on both sides of the street between Oak Grove Avenue and Cherry Avenue, no parking

along the west side of Pine Street from Ravenswood Avenue to Cherry Avenue, and time-limited parking along the east side of Pine Street that extends approximately 100 feet north of Ravenswood Avenue. The width of the street is approximately 24 feet.

To provide a short-term parking area for the adjacent residents, staff is recommending the removal of one on-street parking space on the east side of Pine Street approximately 50 feet south of Oak Grove Avenue and installing 22 feet of white curb with one 5-minute passenger loading and unloading zone sign. The passenger loading and unloading sign would be enforceable twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week. Staff is also recommending the removal of two additional parking spaces and installing 55 feet of red curb directly opposite of loading zone. This recommendation would allow more room for vehicles turning onto Pine Street from Oak Grove Avenue due to the narrow street width.

Impact on City Resources

If approved, there are sufficient funds in the operating budget for the City's signing and striping program to implement this project.

Environmental Review

The installation of white curb is categorically exempt under Class 1 of the California Environmental Quality Act. Class 1 allows for minor alterations of existing facilities, including highways and streets, sidewalks, gutters, bicycle and pedestrian access, and similar facilities, as long as there is negligible or no expansion of use.

Public Notice

Public Notification was achieved by posting the agenda, with the agenda items being listed, at least 72 hours prior to the meeting. Additional public outreach was achieved by sending notification postcards to the residents/property owners within 500 feet of the proposed loading zone.

RESOLUTION OF THE COMPLETE STREETS COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MENLO PARK AUTHORIZING THE INSTALLATION OF A 5 MINUTE PASSENGER LOADING AND UNLOADING ZONE AND RED CURB ON PINE STREET

WHEREAS, on November 13, 2018, City Council adopted a resolution to approve the permanent installation of bicycle improvements on Oak Grove Avenue, Crane Street, and University Drive and to remove on-street parking on Oak Grove Avenue and University Drive; and,

WHEREAS, the installation of a 22-foot long, five minute loading and unloading passenger zone on the east side of Pine Street, 50 feet south of Oak Grove Avenue, is needed for nearby residents; and,

WHEREAS, the installation of 55 feet of red curb on the west side of Pine Street at Oak Grove Avenue is needed to provide adequate turning radius; and,

WHEREAS, Title 1, Chapter 11.24, Sections 026 to 027 of the Menlo Park Municipal Code authorizes the Complete Streets Commission to designate timed or no parking zones as described in the Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the City of Menlo Park, acting by and through its Complete Streets Commission, having considered and been fully advised in the matter and good cause appearing therefore;


