A. Call To Order

C. Reports and Announcements

Staff announced that the April 9, Complete Streets Commission meeting will be held at the Belle Haven Community Campus (BHCC).

D. Public Comment

- Nancy Larocca Hedley spoke in support of traffic calming measures on Partridge Avenue.
- Bill Kirsch spoke in support of the Slow Streets Program and a comprehensive approach to traffic calming on College Avenue, Partridge Avenue and Cambridge Avenue.

E. Regular Business

E1. Accept the Complete Streets Commission minutes for Dec. 11, 2024 and Jan. 8, 2025 (Attachment).

ACTION: Motion and second (Cebrian/ Bailey), to accept the Complete Streets Commission minutes for December 11, 2024 and January 8, 2025, passed unanimously.

E2. Receive an update on the Middle Avenue Traffic Calming Implementation (Attachment)

Staff Machi made the presentation.

The Commission received clarification on the traffic calming elements at Blake Street, efficacy of speed feedback signs and the spacing of those signs, enforcement of speed and when vehicles are parked in the bike lanes and impact of cut-through traffic to neighboring streets to Middle Avenue.

Laura Melahn spoke in support of moving the flashing beacons to the High Visibility Crossing at
Arbor Drive, consideration of the impact of the traffic calming measures on Middle Avenue on
nearby streets and pairing the Middle Avenue improvements with traffic calming experiments on

Allied Arts Streets.

- Bill Kirsch spoke in support of the Middle Avenue traffic calming plan and quick-build, trial traffic calming on College Avenue and Partridge Avenue.
- Paul Sullivan spoke in support of moving the flashing beacons to the High Visibility Crossing at Arbor Drive and simple, low-cost traffic calming on Arbor Road, College Avenue, Cambridge Avenue and Partridge Avenue.
- Michael Lambert spoke in support of increased enforcement at the stop sign on San Mateo Drive and Middle Avenue and speed cameras on Middle Avenue.

The Commission discussed stop compliance for bicyclists, project impacts to cut-through traffic in the neighborhood, safety and enforcement issues related to speeding and parking occurring in the bike lanes, additional traffic calming measures on nearby streets and bollard options to supplement the bike lane buffers on Middle Avenue.

The Commission requested more information on the placement and frequency of speed feedback signs, counts and speed data on Middle Avenue and neighboring streets, the addition of the raised crosswalk and flashing beacons at Yale Road and if the flashing beacons planned for Arbor Road crossing can be moved to the other Arbor Road crossing that does not have the raised crosswalk.

The Commission discussed the importance of addressing low-cost traffic calming on College Avenue and Partridge Avenue, further study of the installation of a stop sign at College Avenue and Arbor Road and exploring the use of bollards in the bike lane on Middle Avenue concurrent with the Middle Avenue improvements this summer.

The Commission received an update on the City Council action on Feb. 11, to support a grant application for future shuttle funding.

F2. Tentative Complete Streets Commission agenda

The Commission discussed adding a dialogue with the police department to share perspectives on various projects.

The Commission discussed rescheduling the April 9 meeting in Belle Haven, due to spring break for the Menlo Park School District, to April 16.



PROJECT SPECIFIC - NEXT STEPS

- Advertise and award the contract for Middle Ave resurfacing and traffic calming implementation (Spring 2025)
 - Work will be partially funded through a TA Grant \$1.2 million
- Construction 70 working days (Summer 2025)
 - Target is to be substantially complete before school begins on August 20th





RELATED WORK - NEXT STEPS

- Olive and Santa Cruz Intersection Design (Summer 2025)
 - Construction is dependent on grant funding
- Gather community feedback on Pilot Projects: Blake St Closure and Back-in Angle Parking at Nealon Park (Fall 2025)
- Continue work on Middle Caltrain Undercrossing
- Continue work on Middle and El Camino Real intersection improvements
- Re-start Neighborhood Traffic Management Program renamed Slow Streets (staffing dependent, TBD)
