- Karen Grove spoke on the importance of establishing a threshold for population variance as part
 of map review as well as maintaining neighborhoods while also using public input to define
 communities of interest that transcend neighborhood boundaries.
- Pam Jones requested clarification on VRA (Voting Rights Act) districts and spoke on vertical districts, natural boundaries, and the need for multiple Districts for certain areas of the City.
- Lynne Bramlett spoke on the importance of maintaining the current district boundaries as much as possible and encouraged additional public engagement for community members who may be

Public Hearing: Fifth public hearing regarding draft maps of the

City's proposed voting Districts

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Independent Redistricting Commission (IRC) conduct the fifth public hearing to receive public input regarding draft maps of the City's proposed voting Districts. Following the close of the public hearing, the IRC will:

- Discuss maps and, by minute order, select maps which should be eliminated from further consideration and select preferred maps to move forward for further consideration at a subsequent meeting; and
- 2. Provide direction to the demographer regarding any maps the IRC would like to have adjusted, drawn and analyzed at a future meeting.

Policy Issues

Pursuant to California Elections Code Section 21627.1, before adopting a final map in the redistricting process, the IRC must hold at least four public hearings at which the public is invited to provide input regarding the composition of one or more Council Districts. At least one public hearing must be held before the commission draws a draft map or maps of the proposed.

Background

While all public input concerning the composition of the city's districts should be considered, all maps must meet the following federal requirements:

- 1. Population equality across districts.
- 2. Race cannot be the predominant factor or criteria when drawing districts.
- 3. Compliance with the federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, which, among other things, prohibits districts that dilute minority voting rights, and encourages a majority-minority district, if the minority group is sufficiently large, and such a district can be drawn without race being the predominant factor.

Additionally, the maps must also meet the following state requirements:

- Maps must be drawn using the following criteria in prioritized order:
- District boundaries must be geographically contiguous:
- District boundaries must minimize the division of neighborhoods and communities of interest;
- District boundaries must be easily identifiable and understandable by residents; and
- District boundaries must be geographically compact.
- Maps must not favor or discriminate against a political party.

Maps must be accompanied by information on the total population, citizen voting age population, and racial and ethnic characteristics of the citizen voting age population.

The last day that a member of the public could submit maps for review was March 25, 2022.

Analysis

Based on public input and other legally required criteria, the City's redistricting demographer has now prepared proposed draft district maps for public review and comment.

At the third public hearing on March 10, 2022, the IRC reviewed six maps and eliminated two maps from further consideration; 1-101 and 1-110. At the fourth public hearing on March 24, 2022, the IRC reviewed 10 maps and eliminated seven maps from consideration; 1-102, 1-105, 1-108, 1-109, 1-17, 1-121, and B2. The following maps, 1-115, 1-120, and 1-124, are still under consideration. In addition to the three remaining maps from the March 24, 2022 meeting, there are six-nine new maps, totaling nine-12 maps for the IRC to review and consider.

The intention of this fifth public hearing is to review all draft maps still under consideration (Attachment A) submitted to the IRC via the Districtr tool (Attachment B.) To support this process, GEOinovo has also provided a series of supplemental maps (Attachment C) of existing districts, school district boundaries, neighborhoods, and population density, for the IRC to reference against the drafts.

Following the close of the public hearing, the IRC will:

- Discuss maps and, by minute order, select maps which should be eliminated from further consideration and select preferred maps to move forward for further consideration at a subsequent meeting; and
- 2. Provide direction to the demographer regarding any maps the IRC would like to have adjusted, drawn and analyzed at a future meeting.

In the interest of reviewing all maps in a timely manner, staff recommends a discussion time of 5-10 minutes per map.

The next public hearing regarding draft maps of the City's proposed voting Districts will be held on April 7, 2022, and the final public hearing to adopt the map establishing the City's voting Districts will be held on April 14, 2022. Pursuant to Elections Code 21608(d), the City is required to publish the final map seven days before adoption.

Impact on City Resources

There is no impact on City resources.

Public Notice

Public notification was achieved by posting the agenda, with the agenda items being listed, at least 72 hours prior to the meeting.

Environmental Review

This action is not a project within the meaning of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines §§ 15378 and 15061(b)(3) as it is a minor change that will not result in any direct or indirect physical change in the environment.


