Hello Chair Arellano, Vice Chair Gilmer, Commissioners, and Staff,

Thank-you for the opportunity to share my comments on the maps being presented tonight.

My comments are based on balancing the population in the current districts. Unless residents throughout the city and each district have publicly voiced dissatisfaction with the current districts, then to substantially change district boundaries for the sole purpose of 0 population balance, may not be in the best interest of the city.

I reviewed AB 849 which states:

SEC. 15.

Section 21601 of the Elections Code is amended to read:

21601.

(a) Following each decennial federal census, and using that census as a basis, the council shall, by ordinance or resolution, adopt boundaries for any or all of the council districts of the city so that the council districts shall be substantially equal in population as required by the United States Constitution.

The current districts have shared boundaries with the length of major roads (where geographically possible); neighborhoods are intact, and a 2 district shared portion of the main downtown business district.

Districts on one side of major roads:

101 Freeway - D1 & D2 Willow Road - D1, D2 & D3 El Camino Real - D2 & D3 Santa Cruz Avenue - D4 & D5

Attached are maps of the Ravenswood City School District property in now **D2**. With the exception of one side of the block on East O'Keefe and LifeMoves/Haven Family House, the residential areas in **D2** are all part of the Menlo Park City School District.

I hope this information is helpful as you move forward with your deliberations and final decisions tonight.
