The Parks and Recreation Master Plan serves as a guiding document for the City as it seeks to improve and maintain the parks and recreation facilities in Menlo Park. It is primarily a planning and policy document and not envisioned to approve specific facilities improvement projects or programs. Projects and programs that are advanced under this Plan would need do undergo their own design, environmental review and approval process prior to being implemented.

Over the past year, extensive community input has been gathered through a variety of methods to assess community needs and recreation demand in the City including community workshops, pop-up and intercept activities, focus groups, stakeholder interviews, online surveys and various social media efforts. A significant amount of the community engagement occurred throughout the City to ensure participation from the community.

Draft guidelines and recommendations for city parks and facilities have been developed and are available for public review at <u>menlopark.org/parkscomments</u>. The focus of the study session will be on these recommendations which cover all of the parks and recreation facilities throughout the City.

# Background

# 1. Summer Camp Registration Now Open

City-run camps, serving ages 3-12, such as Menlo Madness, Menlo Palooza and Camp Menlo are now open for registration. Campers will spend their summer going on field trips, cooking, creating arts & crafts, playing sports, visiting the gymnastics center, swimming and forming new friendships. Along with summer camps, a number of fun new classes are being introduced this summer session. Registration opened on April 22 for residents, and will open on April 25 for unincorporated residents and April 29 for non-residents. # 2. Community Services Department All-Staff Training

On April 12, the Community Services Department held their all-staff training at the Historic Adobe Building in Mountain View. The day included an update on Menlo Perk from the Human Resources Department, work on the department's strategic plan, a discussion on building high performing teams and optimizing communication using the DISC profile led by former City Manager and Parks and Recreation Director of Roseville, Mike Shellito, as well as an abundance of teambuilding activities. A lot of great work was accomplished and it was a wonderful opportunity to bond with our team.

# 3. Week of the Young Child

The Week of the Young Child is an annual celebration hosted by the National Association of the Education of Young Children (NAEYC). It is a time when early learning is celebrated along with children and their families. The purpose of the Week of the Young Child is to focus public attention on the needs of young children and their families and to recognize the early childhood programs and services that meet those needs. We also understand that we must first build relationships with our families to secure the long-lasting relationships that we will have as children continue to participate in our childcare programs. This year, the celebration takes place during April 15-19. The childcare programs in the City plan a week of fun activities that celebrate the joy of being a child and hosts various activities that participants in our programs enjoy. From the simplest activities like Crazy Hair

Day or an ice cream social to more unique experiences like bringing in a petting zoo or hosting a Spring Carnival, the week provides the children with the opportunity for freedom of expression and creativity. Families look forward to the Week of the Young Child activities each year and fun is had by all.

### 4. Belle Haven Spring Fair April 27

The Belle Haven Spring Fair takes place Saturday, April 27 from 11am-2pm. The fair will take place at the Ivy Street Plaza located between Belle Haven Elementary School and the Belle Haven Child Development Center. The event will include representatives from local agencies that provide support to the Belle Haven and East Palo Alto communities. Various departments of the City of Menlo Park will also be present. This is a wonderful opportunity to connect with local resources, enjoy local entertainment and free food. There will also be a dessert fundraiser to support the Beechwood School which is also located in Menlo Park.

# 5. Menlo Park Fire Department Visits the Senior Center

The fire marshal visited the Senior Center on March 28 to speak with seniors about smoke alarm safety, and the replacement project sponsored by the Fire District. The crowd had a chance to ask questions and get valuable information about fire safety from the experts. Fire personnel later joined the seniors for lunch.

### 6. Special Study Session and Council Meeting at the Senior Center

The Community Services Department presented the draft guidelines and goals from the Park and Facilities Master Plan to the City Council on Tuesday, April 16, 2019. These guidelines and recommendations for city parks and facilities are available for public review at <a href="http://menlopark.org/parkcomments">http://menlopark.org/parkcomments</a>. The full draft report will be available on May 16 as part of May 21 City Council agenda packet. The master plan is scheduled to be reviewed by the Parks and Recreation Commission at their meeting on May 22 and received by the City Council at their meeting on June 18.

### 7. Bedwell Bayfront Park Trail Head Improvements

This spring, the Public Works Department will be installing various amenities at four trail heads in Bedwell Bayfront Park. The first and last trail heads will include an 18 foot by 6 foot concrete pad with a trash can, recycle can, dog bag dispenser, bench, bike rack, and park rules and hours signs. Due to space restrictions, the other trail heads will include a 14 foot by 6 foot concrete pad with a trash can, recycle can, dog bag dispenser, bench, and park rules and hours signs (no bike rack).

In coordination with the Friends of Bedwell Bayfront Park, their informational sign will be relocated to the opposite side of the trail head entrance. The City will also relocate the educational storyboards near trail heads to provide easier access for visitors, and the three storyboards on the lookout will be replaced with porcelain enamel graphic panels for improved weather resistance.

These improvements were recommended in the Bedwell Bayfront Park Master Plan.
