- + Construction of the Menlo Park Community Campus (MPCC) project has begun
- + The new facility is scheduled to open in 2023
- + Designed to be a complex, multigenerational center that combines a wide range of programs and services under one roof
- + Because of this complexity and the associated workload, developing the facility's various programming elements will require careful planning and sequencing over time.

A community effort with multiple stakeholders

- + Every Menlo Park resident is a stakeholder in the project's success, especially neighborhood residents
- + City Council, MPCC Subcommittee (Nash, Taylor) and working group
- + Advisory bodies: Library Commission, Parks & Recreation Commission
- + Community groups, individuals, volunteers, external partners

Programming goals

- + Fulfills the vision of a multigenerational community center that delivers high-quality services and programs that are inclusive for all Menlo Park residents
- + Fosters a sense of belonging, safety, and welcome to all visitors, especially neighborhood residents
- + Inspires creativity, community, learning, discovery, wellness and growth for people of all ages and walks of life


Programming goals – cont'd


- + Provides traditional programs of a branch library, recreation center, senior center, afterschool care, and swim center
- + Leverages the synergies of a combined multigenerational facility through innovative programs that benefit the community
- + Creates new, high-quality programs that previously were not available but are made possible by the new facility.

Study session focus

- + Review a draft timeline and sequence for developing the various elements of the programming plan over the next several months
- + Receive feedback from the Library Commission and Parks and Recreation Commission at the outset of the process
- + This study session is NOT focused on developing the programming elements themselves in detail
- + This study session is NOT focused on naming the new facility. The facility naming will be undertaken through a separate engagement process at the direction of the City Council.

Regular Business: Willow Oaks Park updates

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Commission review this update on projects related to Willow Oaks Park.

Policy Issues

As a duly appointed advisory body to the City Council, the Parks and Recreation Commission advises the City Council on matters related to the City's parks and recreation facilities.

Background

Willow Oaks Park consists of 2.63 acres of City property at 490 Willow Road. The park contains a play structure, tennis courts, paved walking paths, and an enclosed area where off-leash dogs are permitted. The park shares a border with two schools – Willow Oaks School and the Silicon Valley International School. A playing field directly connected to the park (with a baseball field and a large open grassy area in the outfield) is owned by the Ravenswood City School District (RSCD) and is a part of Willow Oaks School. The playing field is programmed by the City during non-school hours under the terms of a MOU signed in 2001. The City's Public Works - Parks Division currently maintains the outfield under the terms of the MOU.

A map showing the respective City-owned and RCSD-owned parcels is included with this report as Attachment C.

Analysis

Willow Oaks Park was recommended for capital improvements in the 2019 Parks and Recreation Facilities Master Plan Update (Attachment A, pages 88-89). Some recommended improvements have now been approved and scheduled as part of the City's Capital Improvement Program (CIP) (Attachment B, page 5):

- Improvements to the off-leash dog area
- Construction and installation of restrooms
- Replacing and upgrading the play structure
- Constructing a connecting bicycle path through the park to Elm Street

The City's Public Works Department manages CIP projects and gathered community input on the planned improvements. The design phase of the project is nearing completion, and proposed designs will be presented to the Commission and before the public for their input in early 2022. Construction on the park improvements is tentatively scheduled to begin in summer 2022.

Impact on City Resources

There is no impact on City resources.

Environmental Review

This action is not a project within the meaning of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA Guidelines §§ 15378 and 15061(b)(3) as it will not result in any direct or indirect physical change in the environment. The construction project will be subject to environmental review.

Public Notice

Public notification was achieved by posting the agenda, with the agenda items being listed, at least 72 hours prior to the meeting.

Informational Item: Department updates

- 1. <u>Tree lighting and food donation drive at Fremont Park</u>. Commissioners are invited to help "light up the season of giving" with an outdoor tree lighting ceremony and donation drive on Friday, December 10 at 5:00 p.m. Join the fun and giving spirit as Mayor Drew Combs lights the big tree in Fremont Park. Bring a non-perishable food item to benefit local families with the help of local nonprofit organization, Samaritan House. After the tree lighting, attendees are encouraged to take a stroll down Santa Cruz Avenue and enjoy the many local businesses and restaurants that downtown Menlo Park has to offer.
- 2. <u>Arrillaga Family Recreation Center</u>. Activity at the center is increasing as more programs and services come online and more community members return to the facility.
 - Winter/Spring classes are approaching with registration starting in the beginning of December.
 - Staff has formed a new partnership with Bay Area Friendship Circle to provide adaptive/inclusive programs for Menlo Park children and families.
 - Facility rentals are set to resume in January 2022, subject to change as state and county health orders allow.
 - The facility's kitchen has been updated to meet commercial kitchen standards and will begin preparing daily hot lunches for older adults on December 6.
- 3. Registration software platform. The City of Menlo Park IT Master Plan identified the need to replace the City's existing registration software platform with a new platform that leverages recent advancements in technology and is more responsive to current and future needs. A team of subject matter experts from multiple City departments is evaluating potential new platforms with the goal of completing a system migration and launching the new platform by mid-2022.
- 4. <u>In-person storytime returns to Main Library and Belle Haven Branch</u>. Family storytimes are now held inperson and are led by skilled and experienced library staff. The sessions feature songs, finger plays and other proven techniques to instill a love of reading and learning in young children and improve literacy outcomes later in life. Sessions are free to the public and are held in a welcoming and safe environment at the Main Library and Belle haven Branch. Storytimes also are provided at the Menlo Children's Center, Belle Haven Child Development Center, and Belle Haven Youth Center (afterschool care).
- 5. Child care spaces are available (for now). Menlo Children's Center provides licensed weekday child care and preschool education to children ages 18 months through 5 years old. Located on the Burgess Park campus, the center is operated by the City of Menlo Park and a professional team of dedicated, diverse and positive role models who provide a safe and caring environment that promotes self-expression and social development. The center also provides quality (and fun) child care for schoolaged children during the afterschool hours. The center is historically in very high demand on the strength of its high quality of care and convenient location. Spaces are available now, and are expected to fill up in the new year.
