**Regular Business:** Overview of City of Menlo Park fiscal year 2025-26 proposed budget – Library and Community Services department

### Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Library Commission (LC) and Parks and Recreation Commission (PRC) receive an overview of the information contained in the City of Menlo Park's public budget portal, with focus on the Library and Community Services (LCS) department section. The City of Menlo Park fiscal year 2025-26 proposed budget is anticipated to be made available for viewing on the public budget portal on May 28 (Attachment A).

### Policy Issues

Menlo Park Municipal Code §2.08.080 (8) provides that the city manager must "prepare and submit to the City Council the annual budget." The City is required to adopt its budget before July 1 of each year.

As advisory bodies to the City Council, the LC and PRC do not authorize budgets or allocate City resources. The authority to authorize City budgets and allocate City resources rests solely with the City Council.

### Background

On March 22, the City Council held a priority-setting workshop to help inform the development of the City's fiscal year 2025-26 budget (Attachment B).

On April 15, the City Council approved its fiscal year 2025-26 budget principles and budget development timeline (Attachment C).

On May 13, the City Council held two study sessions on the updated General Fund forecast for fiscal years 2024-25 through 2028-29 (Attachment D); and the five-year Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) (Attachment E).

### Analysis

The City of Menlo Park fiscal year 2025-26 proposed operating budget is anticipated to be made available on the City of Menlo Park's public budget portal on May 28 (Attachment A). City staff is preparing to present an overview of the information contained in the public budget portal, with focus on the Library and Community Services department section, to the LC and PRC May 28.

### Impact on City Resources

As advisory bodies to the City Council, the LC and PRC do not authorize budgets or allocate City resources.

The authority to authorize City budgets and allocate City resources such as City budgets rests solely with the City Council.

#### Regular Business:

Preview the results of the library, recreation, and parks community survey 2025

### Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Library Commission (LC) and Parks and Recreation Commission (PRC) preview the results of the recently conducted library, recreation, and parks community survey (Attachment A). Staff is in the process of preparing detailed analyses of the survey for the LC and PRC to review tentatively June 16 and June 25, respectively.

### Policy Issues

As a duly appointed advisory body to the City Council, the LC advises the City Council on matters related to the City's libraries.

As a duly appointed advisory body to the City Council, the PRC advises the City Council on matters related to the City's parks and recreation facilities.

### Background

On March 17, the LC reviewed and offered feedback on a draft of the library, recreation and parks survey (Attachment B).

On March 26, the PRC reviewed and offered feedback on a draft of the library, recreation and parks survey (Attachment C).

### Analysis

The City of Menlo Park periodically conducts citywide community surveys to gain insight into Menlo Park residents' needs, preferences and ideas for City services. Recently completed citywide community surveys include:

- Child care needs survey in September-October 2024 (Attachment C)
- Aquatics user survey in October-November 2024 (Attachment D).

#### Preview of survey results

In April-May 2025, City staff conducted a community wide survey focused on the City's libraries, recreation centers, and parks. The survey was open from April 26 to May 18, and was distributed in English and Spanish through direct email; on social media; on banner announcements on City webpages; via printed surveys distributed in City facilities; and through in-person outreach to facility visitors.

The survey received responses from 1,121 participants, approximately three-quarters of whom self-

identified as incorporated City of Menlo Park residents. Survey participants also shared over 1,600 free-text comments. The survey results are provided in Attachment A.

#### Next steps

The survey closed on May 18. Staff is in the process of preparing detailed analyses of the survey results for the LC and PRC to review tentatively June 16 and June 25, respectively.

As advisory bodies to the City Council, the LC and PRC do not authorize budgets or allocate City resources. The authority to authorize City budgets and allocate City resources rests solely with the City Council. There is no substantive impact to the City's general fund related to the topics in this report.

Public schools in the City have gyms. They should be open for booking community-based events and activities as needed so as not to be taking up the extremely limited outdoor space in this community with buildings, on public land, that exclude significant parts of the community from access because of their cost. In my public elementary school I participated in an excellent gymnastics program run by the phys ed teacher before school. It all happened in the multi-purpose room which doubled as cafeteria and gym throughout the rest of the day. Sure, the tumbling mats, and uneven bars and vault chalk smells mixed with odors of cleaning agent which had recently mopped up spilled milk. But we developed responsibility and a true sense of community by setting up and taking down the equipment each morning. It's a far cry from the slice of Menlo Park which lightly uses these facilities by rolling out of mini-vans and Tesla Model X's a few times a year for a volleyball game in the gym and for supposedly crowded gymnastics classes which, in reality, are occupying a huge amount of public space for the benefit of a very small portion of the population. That so much space is taken up by a gigantic gymnastics hall and parking means that at peak times it's virtually impossible to come to one's neighborhood park and kick a ball around. The fields tend to be fully booked by pay-to-play organizations. I have never before lived in a place like Menlo Park where the forms of exclusion are so invisible yet so out in the open. New York City has far better public space options than Menlo Park despite NY's density. Where I grew up, people who wanted to hyper-enroll their children in "activities" like gymnastics or special gym-related events did so through private clubs and other private sector options, all built on private property. In this city, instead of a public-private partnership, the Arrillaga money managed to produce an invasion of the very limited, central, public space in Menlo Park by private activity exclusivity. That I have to take my child through "his" public park and tell him we cannot afford to participate in most of the activities happening there -- from private bounce houses to entire gigantic buildings and swimming pools is unconscionable. We are not poor. We would not qualify for most of the "subsidies" to include him in some activities, but that does not mean we can afford to keep up with the Menlo Park Joneses. Households earning more than \$150K but less than \$300K, even with some Prop 13-derived housing subsidy support, have to make hard choices about how to raise their kids and we don't need the \$300K+ Joneses occupying the public space and shoving that wealth before the eyes of our truly average family. Put that type of private coddling and scaffolding back where it belongs. In private clubs on private land. These \$150-300K families tend also to be in rentals so they have few, safe, outdoor options for play and physical activity outside the public park. The single-family-home, \$300K+ families mostly have backyards. I think Menlo Park needs a total re-envisioning of what it thinks is a successful public-private partnership approach to managing public resources. The ambitious Housing and Environmental Justice elements which we are pursuing so avidly this decade are going to fail miserably in the coming decades when they run slam into the limited public, free community spaces because of this Arrillaga, supposed, generosity. Please re-envision the entire Civic Center campus purpose to have as much fully open, fully public options available. It's not clear to me that the SRI re-development is going to help with this aspect of social justice. It will provide safer pathways through to get to M-A, by bike or on foot but it does

It's a zoo -- a high tech joke with so few books it's pitiful. Karaoke machine rentals and spots equipment borrowing don't belong in a library. They belong in the recreation center across the way. When I emailed the library staff asking if there was a way for me to contact the instructor to get the information from the first class forwarded to me so I can catch up for the second class, I was told that the library staff doesn't give out the contact info of the instructors. I then asked if I could have the instructor contacted on my behalf to get this information and never received a response. They also rescheduled one of the classes to another day that I was not able to attend. When I emailed asking for either another way to make up the class or a refund for that specific session, I didn't receive any response. This has made me feel unwelcome and unsupported and I am considering dropping the class altogether. It also feels very unprofessional since this is a class that I paid money for. While it's not expensive, I am substitute teacher and don't make a lot of money so even losing out on small amounts of money really impacts my budget. I am imagining that part of the issue and why staff are not giving out instructor contact info is partly because the instructors aren't paid for their time outside of class and partly that they don't want to give out their personal contact info. Now these are assumptions on my part but if they are true, I recommend providing instructors with a stipend to handle administrative tasks outside of class time or assign a full time staff member to support the class. Additionally, providing instructors with a library email address would allow students to contact the instructor if needed without giving out their personal email or encroaching on personal hours.

	1319	Preteens, teens, even adults who run through the Burgess park with electric bikes or fast regular bikes, thinking that saying "excuse me" a 90 years old can swiftly jump out of the way. 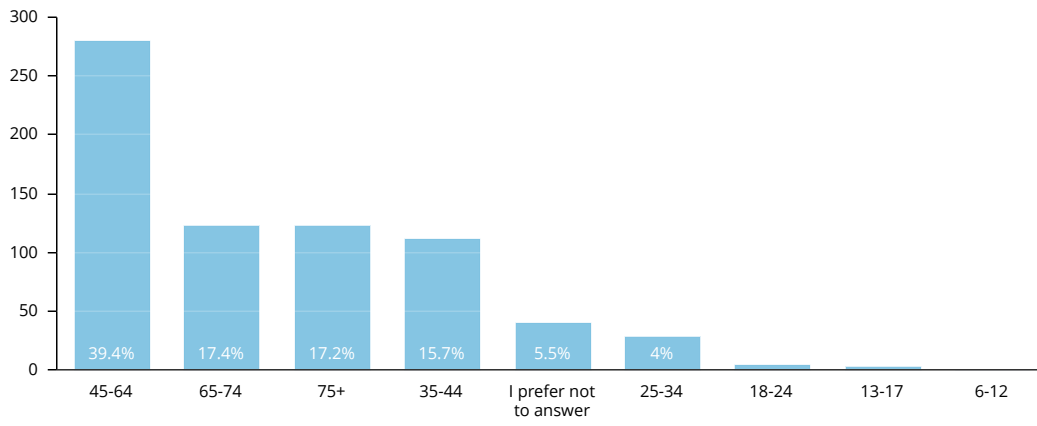

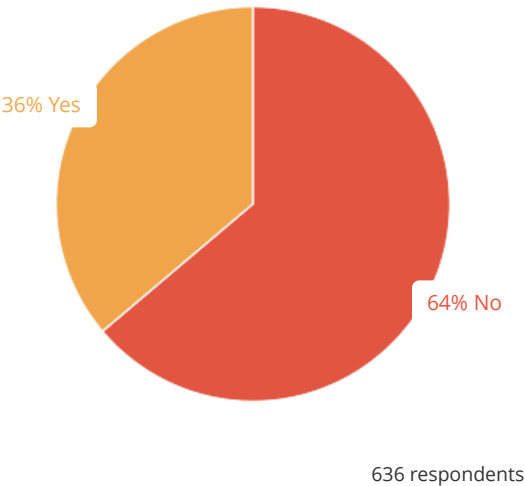

Informational Item: Library and Community Services department statistics and recent activities

Recommendation

City staff recommends that the Parks and Recreation Commission (PRC) and Library Commission (LC) review and provide feedback on the statistics and recent activities in the Library and Community Services (LCS) department outlined in this report.

Policy Issues

As a duly appointed advisory body to the City Council, the PRC and the LC are charged with advising the City Council on matters related to the City's library, recreation programs and facilities.

Background

LCS provides a wide range of lifelong learning and recreational opportunities for Menlo Park residents of all ages, abilities, and lived experiences. Programs and facilities include public libraries, recreation and sports, early childhood education, after-school programs, summer youth camps, older adults (senior) services, athletic fields and courts, community events, and aquatics.

Analysis

April 2025 statistics

LCS collects statistics related to department activities. These data help to inform decision-making and improve services to the community. Monthly statistics for April 2025 are provided in Attachment A.

Event recap: Spring festival and egg hunt

The Menlo Park community came together to celebrate the annual Spring Festival and Egg Hunt event at Burgess Park and Arrillaga Family Recreation Center on April 19. The City of Menlo Park welcomed an estimated 2,200 friends and family to celebrate spring and the natural world with a community festival including a petting zoo, photos with the big bunny, children's crafts, ride on a historic fire truck, and related attractions.

The 2025 event marked the debut of advance tickets and pastoral-themed hunting areas for the popular Egg Hunt attraction. The advance tickets made it so the flow of the event was managed and carried out as safely as possible for the children. Approximately 800 young egg hunters registered in advance for the Egg Hunt, including nearly 600 Menlo Park residents and over 200 non-residents.

This year's event also introduced a sensory-friendly Egg Hunt to provide a safe and inclusive experience for children who are neurodivergent, have sensory sensitivities or find large groups overwhelming. The event

was held indoors at the Arrillaga Family Recreation Center and featured smaller groups, longer hunt times, and a calm and engaging environment. The City of Menlo Park partnered with Ayers Family Plastic Eggs, a small business that employs individuals with disabilities. Through the partnership, 12,000 treat-filled eggs were distributed at the event. Special thanks to event sponsors Cheeky Monkey Toys and Menlo Park Firefighters Association.

#### Event recap: Youth Poetry Voices

April was National Poetry Month, and youth were invited to join the City of Menlo Park and Menlo Park Library Foundation for the annual Menlo Park Youth Poetry Voices exhibition. This exhibition allowed children from first through twelfth grade to share their original poetry. Poets had the opportunity to read their poem at a reception hosted by Menlo Park Library, and their work will be published in a commemorative anthology on display in our Local Authors Collection. On May 13, poets were recognized as a group before the City Council. Featured poets were invited to present their poems directly to City Council.

#### Summer Reading Game begins June 1

The annual Menlo Park Summer Reading Game is an all-ages program designed to keep students and adults reading over the summer break. Participants can expect to discover great books, enjoy in-person and online activities, and earn prizes for reading. Participants may sign up from June 1 through Aug. 31 by visiting the Summer Reading Game webpage (Attachment B).

#### Youth Advisory Committee menstrual product drive

The Youth Advisory Committee (YAC) organized a menstrual product donation drive to support teen health. The products were assembled into individual kits to be distributed to Menlo-Atherton High School students on the upcoming Feel Good Friday. Some kits were also delivered to Mid-Peninsula and Sacred Heart schools. In total, the drive collected and/or funded the following:

- Eighty-four (84) pairs of disposable period underwear
- Four hundred and twenty (420) organic cotton tampons
- Eight hundred and ninety-six (896) Tampax Radiant tampons
- Four hundred and fifty-four (454) Tampax Pearl tampons
- One thousand three hundred and one (1301) pads
- Eight hundred and twenty-six (826) liners

From the total collected items, committee members assembled approximately 100 menstrual kits. Each menstrual kit contained an equal combination of products (although some kits didn't have the period underwear because there was a shortage of 14 pairs). Leftover pads and tampons will be used to stock bathrooms at the community centers.

#### Aquatics working group

The City of Menlo Park and aquatics operator Menlo Swim and Sport co-hosted an Aquatics Working Group session at Belle Haven Community Campus May 20. The session was open to the public and was attended by approximately 40 people. Approximately 90% of the participants indicated that they are Menlo Park residents, and approximately 75% indicated that they are Belle Haven Pool users. The session was focused on gathering community feedback about Belle Haven Pool, including positive aspects of the pool and areas for improvement, scholarships for youth swim lessons, and community outreach to increase pool attendance. City staff is compiling detailed notes from the session and is preparing to post them to the City's aquatics webpage by May 28 (Attachment C).

#### Belle Haven Pool and Burgess Pool schedule changes

Aquatics operator Menlo Swim and Sport informed the City of Menlo Park about schedule changes at

Burgess Pool, and extending the timeline of previously implemented schedule changes at Belle Haven Pool, citing the need to improve efficiency. Menlo Swim and Sport has indicated that they intend to increase hours at both pools in early June. The current pool schedules are as follows:

Belle Haven Pool - Current hours of operation

- Monday: 10:00am – 12:00pm; 3:30pm – 7:00pm
- Tuesday – Thursday: 3:30pm – 7:00pm
- Friday: 10:00am – 12:00pm; 3:30pm – 7:00pm
- Saturday: 9:00am – 3:30pm
- Sunday: 11:00am – 3:00pm

Burgess Pool - Current hours of operation

- Monday – Friday: 6:00am – 1:00pm; 3:00pm – 7:00pm
- Saturday: 6:00am – 5:00pm
- Sunday: 7:00am – 5:00pm

In addition, Menlo Swim and Sport has confirmed that the Aquafit classes at Belle Haven Pool will have an earlier start time at 10 a.m. when classes resume June 17, in order to allow users of the Menlo Park Senior Center enough time to complete the Aquafit class before the senior center's daily lunch service.

Additional details about swim center schedules are available on the Menlo Swim and Sport website (Attachment D).

Park Ranger request for proposals

The City of Menlo Park has issued a request for proposals (RFP) for park ranger services at City parks. The scope of work may include, but is not limited to, the following tasks: perform daily patrols, enforce park regulations, collect litter, and suppress fire, if needed. Proposals are due at 5 p.m. June 23. The complete timeline and additional information are available online (Attachment E).
