basis for site layout

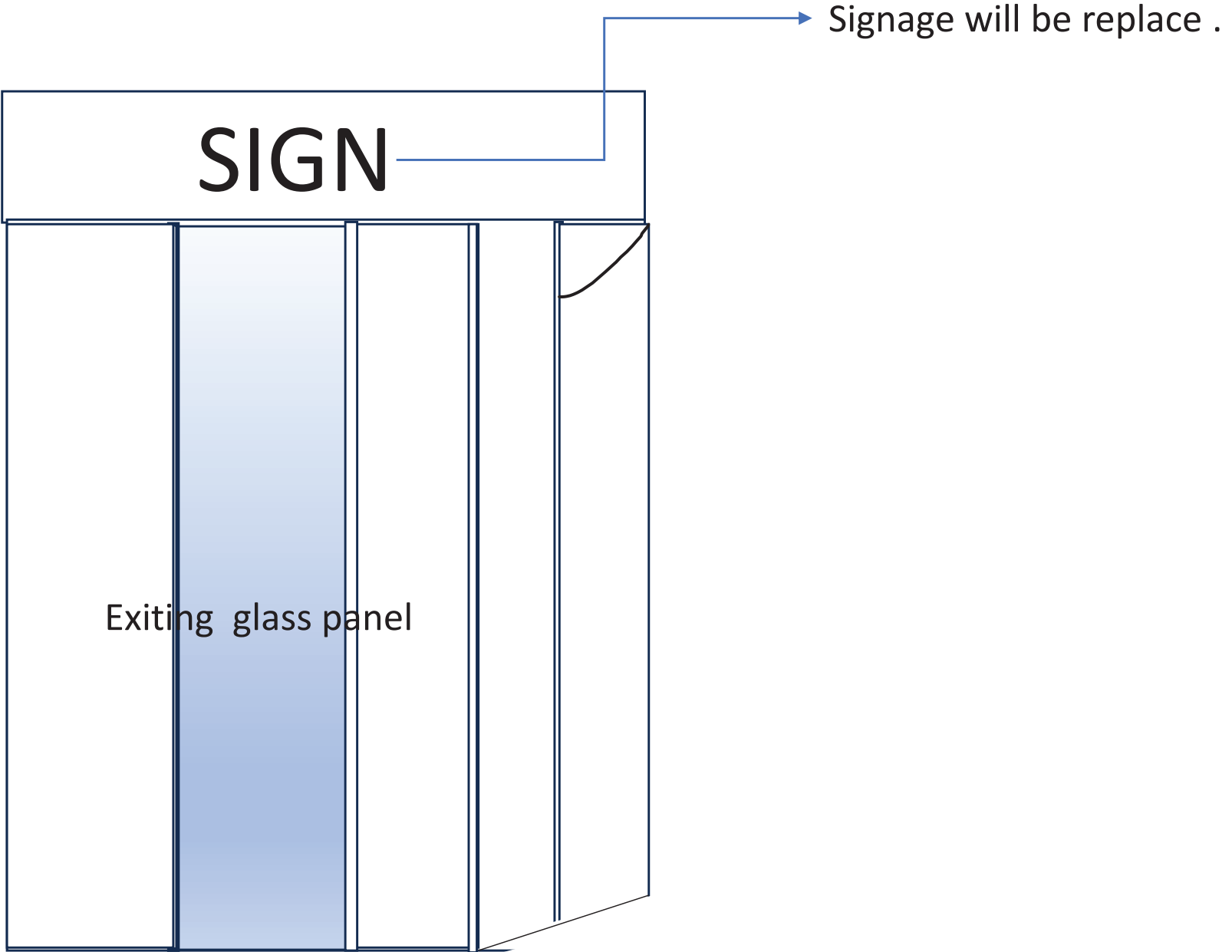

There will be no outreach to neighboring properties. All proposed and suggested services are contained within the proposed site location.



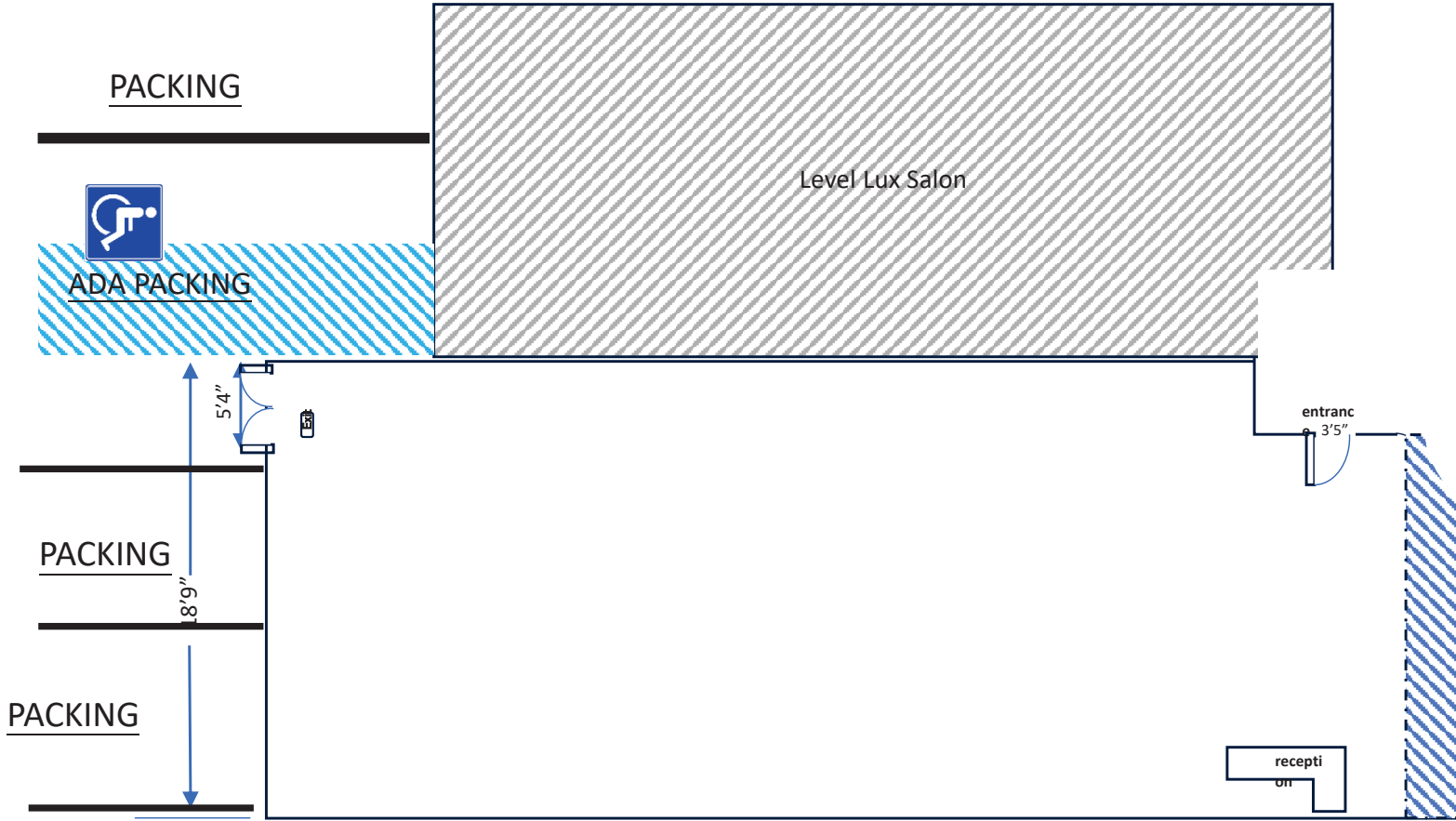

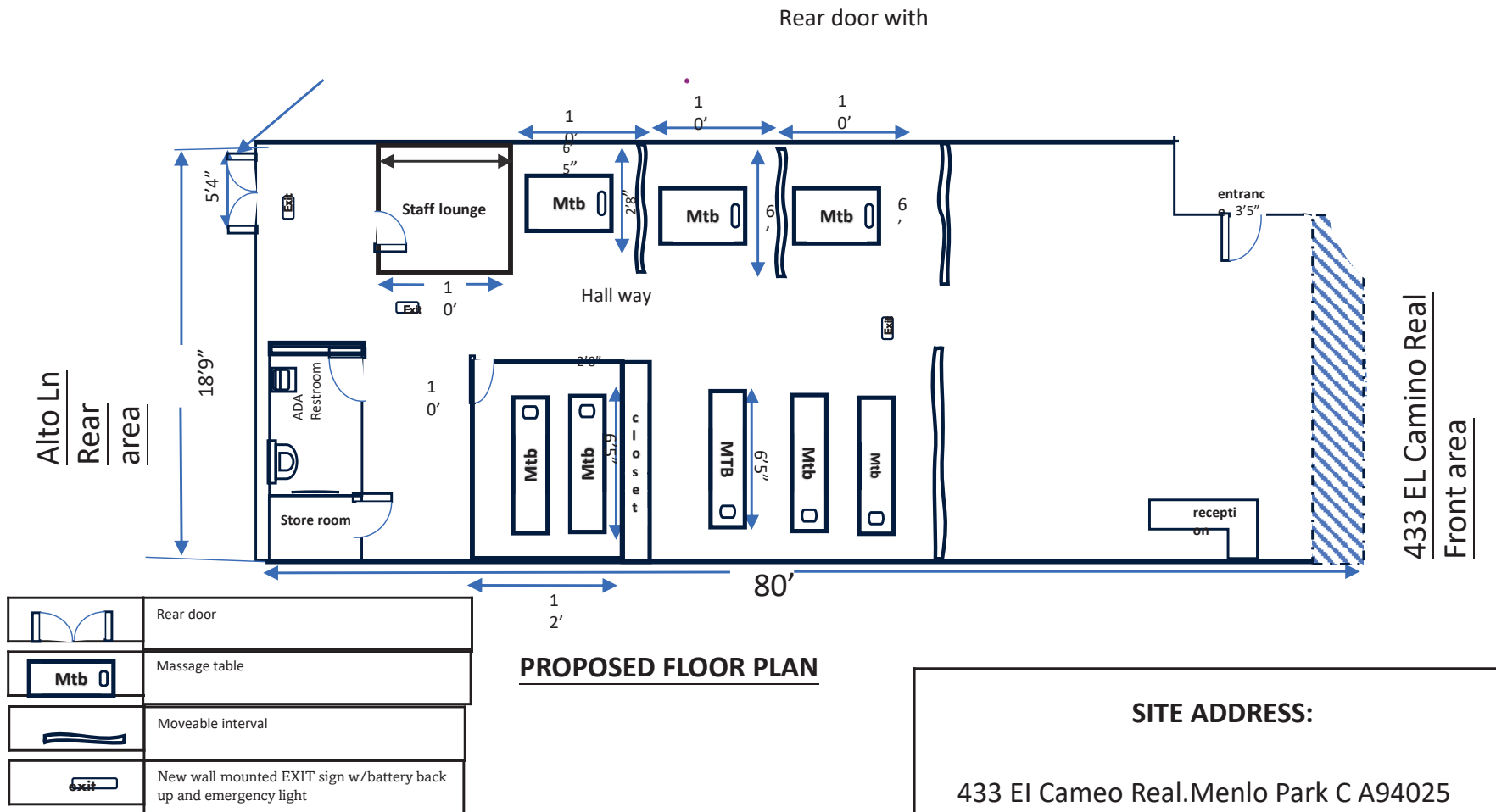
Alto Ln Rear area

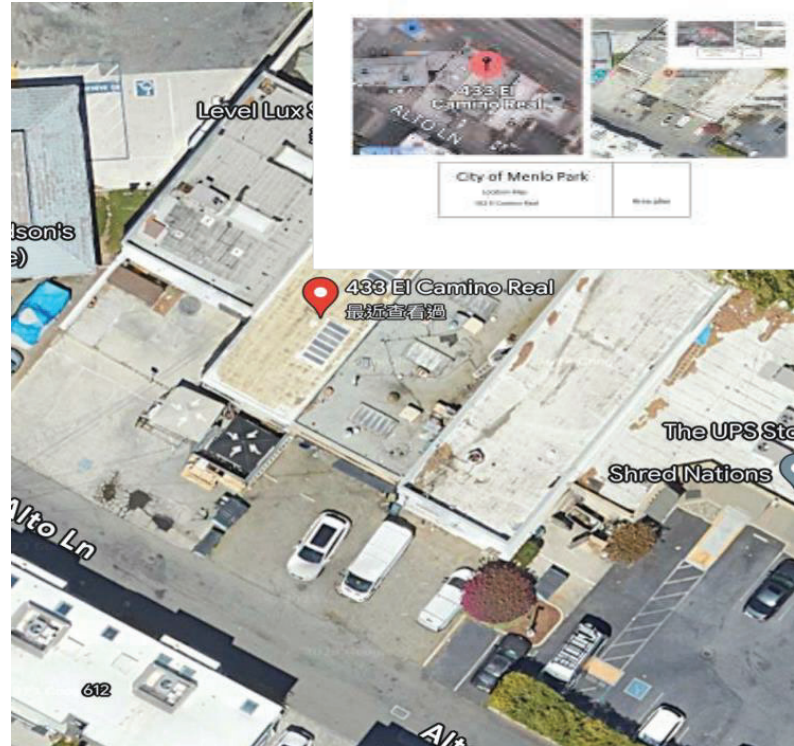

Area plan

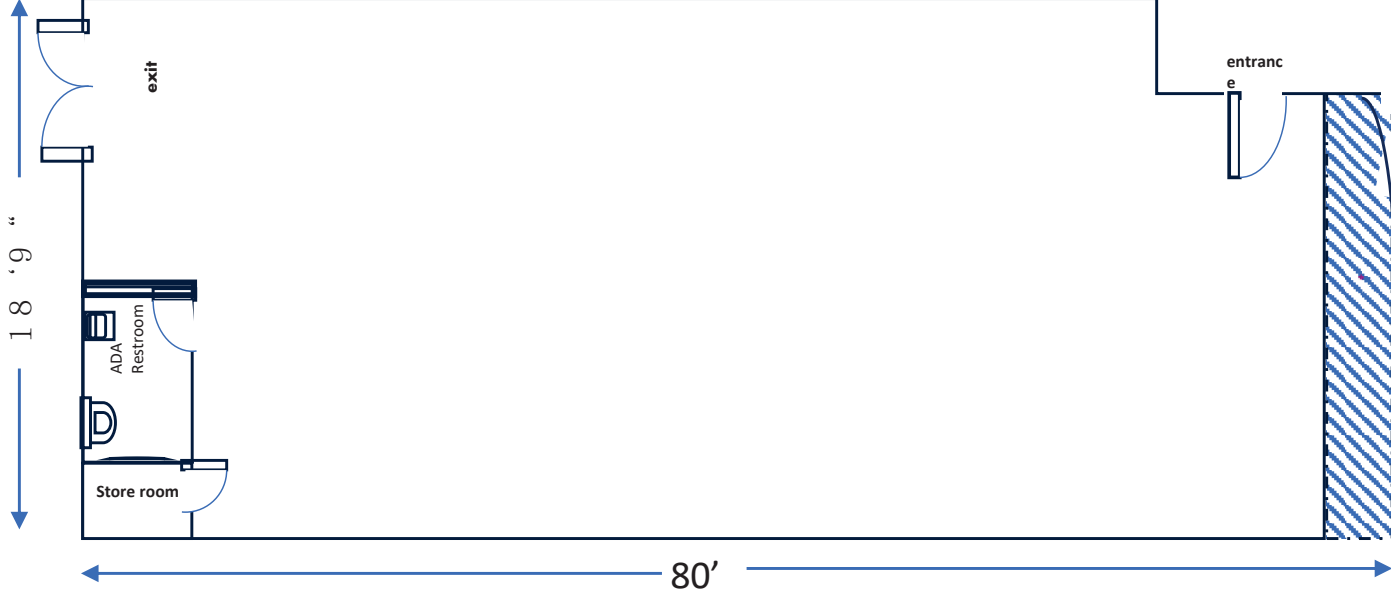
