
Pedestrian Safety Curriculum for PE teachers

MENLO PARK SRTS PROGRAM | NEXT YEAR OVERVIEW



- SRTS budget halved for FY2020-21 due to budget deficits
- Few engagement events if any at all
- Emphasis next year more on coordination/support rather than events
- Using budget to retain SRTS Coordinator to assist schools and districts with educational materials, engagement, grant applications, etc.

M-A Transportation Overview

The Basics:

- 2,499 students
- No district-provided buses (except for those provided per IEPs)
- BGCP: PM bus to EPA.
- Public transportation: SamTrans routes (81; 86; 296); M1 and M2 Shuttles
 - Discounted bus passes



M-A Transportation: What's Going Well

- 2019 W-Trans Audit (November):
 - Students driving themselves: 15% (2018) to 10% (2019)
 - Students picked up from school: 31% (2018) to 33% (2019)
 - Walking/ Rolling to school: 35% (2018) to 40% (2019)
 - Walking/ Rolling *from* school: 41% (2018) to 53% (2019)
 - Decrease in overall AM driving: 70% (2015) to 60% (2019)
 - Decrease in overall PM driving: 63% (2015) to 49% (2019)
 - Increase in overall non-car AM: 39% (2015) to 43% (2019)



M-A Transportation: What's Going Well

Bike Shed Program/ "M-A on the Move":

- Bike donation=> repair => redonate
 - Need
 - Theft
- Restorative practices
- Community
- Lock rentals
