1) School Updates

- Laurel Elementary:
 - 2 bike rodeos organized for 3rd and 4th grades
 - ~220 students participated
 - 30 parent volunteers over the two days. SRTS parent champions coordinated with PE teachers and the school staff to reorganize the schedule for the two days to plan the bike rodeo.
 - SMCOE donated helmets and James Nelson from Menlo-Atherton High School bike club helped with bike donations.
 - Partnership with Facebook bike shop donated used and refurbished bikes to donated to students.
 - A third bike rodeo will be organized later this year for 5th graders.
 - Community school ride/field trip for 5th graders to be organized in the spring.

- The school administration is working with parent champions on a five-lesson bike curriculum. They would like the help of the Police Department to put together a short videoclip on traffic safety and rules of the road to be incorporated in the curriculum.
- Ellen Kraska is moving to Encinal in January. Ashley Guilliot will be the Interim Assistant Principal.

Oak Knoll Elementary:

- 1 bike rodeo for 3rd grade organized with Safe Moves, mini city set up (1 full day, 30-minute segment). Funded with the San Mateo County Office of Education Safe Routes to School grant.
- A parent champion surveyed the parents to know in advance which student needed a bike for the events and what was the level of comfort of their student on a bike before the bike rodeo. 11 bikes and helmets were donated by a bike shop.

4) Traffic and Safety Updates

- The Menlo Park Police Department got a grant of \$700,000 to educate drivers, bicyclists and pedestrians on traffic safety. In May, the focus will be on bicycle safety.
- Oak Knoll Ln: unfilled crossing guard position (filled by school staff). Near misses daily.
- Raise awareness among students and children on what to do in case of emergency, collisions and near-miss. Especially 5th, 6th and 7th grade students need to be educated on how to ride downtown, understood the real-life situations and be able to self-advocate when needed, e.g., when they get doored.
- The Readiness Checklist to let your Child Walk or Bike Alone
 - Important to educate children and students on what to do in case of a collision or other incidents. For more tips, check the following check lists:
