

# **PROJECT BACKGROUND**

- Complete Streets Policy (2013)
- General Plan Circulation Element (2016)
- Middle Plaza 500 El Camino Real (2017)
- Speed Limit Survey (2020)
- Transportation Master Plan (2020)
- High Priority Project (2021)



## **PROJECT GOALS**

- Provide safe, comfortable and convenient roadway for travel via automobile, foot, and bicycle, consistent with the City's General Plan
- Ensure that the right of way is designed for all users
- Increase accessibility for and use of streets by pedestrian, bicyclists and transit users
- Eliminate traffic fatalities and reduce the number of non-fatal collisions, consistent with the City's Vision Zero Policy



# MIDDLE AVENUE OVERVIEW

- 65' City right of way
- 42' wide curb to curb
- Edge lanes with parallel parking
- No separation for bicyclists
- Varying land use
  - Single family residences
  - Apartments
  - Pre-school, daycare, church
  - Parks
  - El Camino Real







# MIDDLE AVENUE OVERVIEW

- University Drive El Camino Real Speed limit: 25 mph Observed speed: 29.8 mph
- Olive Street University Drive
  Speed limit: 30 mph
  Observed speed: 32.7 mph
